First Announcement

The 12th Romanian-Finnish Seminar will take place in Turku, August 17-21, 2009. The collaboration between the Romanian and Finnish mathematicians in Geometric Function Theory and Classical Analysis was initiated by Simion Stoilow and Rolf Nevanlinna, and this series of conferences deals with the current trends of the field.

The conference is organized by the Universities of Turku, Helsinki, and Joensuu from Finland, in cooperation with the Institute of Mathematics “Simion Stoilow” of the Romanian Academy and with the Faculty of Mathematics and Informatics of the University of Bucharest.

2. Quasiconformal mappings and Teichmüller spaces,
3. Potential theory and PDEs, geometric analysis, metric geometry and related topics in classical analysis.

There will be invited and contributed lectures and poster sessions. Participants intending to give a lecture are requested to send a one-page abstract by e-mail.
